Job Description: The Attorney General's Office in Augusta has an anticipated vacancy for a full-time position as Assistant Attorney General in the Consumer Protection Division to specialize in litigating consumer cases. While position primarily involves enforcing the Maine Unfair and Deceptive Trade Practices Act, there will also be opportunities to work on antitrust cases and cases involving public charities. Our cases are primarily civil, but there is also a possibility of some criminal enforcement.

The position involves work on a national level and coordinates with Attorneys General in other states as well as local enforcement in state court. Typically, the position involves some out of state travel. (We do not yet know when that travel will resume.) Minimum Qualifications: Essential qualifications for this position include strong written and oral advocacy skills, sound judgment, and the ability to work effectively as part of a team. Candidates must be well-organized and manage multiple tasks effectively. Prior litigation experience is preferred, but not required. Recent law school graduates with essential qualifications noted above and superior academic records will be considered. Candidates must be members of the Maine Bar in good standing.
